## Notes

Datable contexts are mostly 1st century AD, and Roman versions are known: e.g. in the post-Boudiccan levels at Chelmsford (unpublished), and otherwise as yet unknown in Essex at earlier dates. It is predominantly a Herts. fashion, where 1st century BC contexts include Braughing, Wheathampstead, and possibly Gorhambury. In Kent, the Julliberries Grave pot is undoubtedly post-conquest (cf. Birchington, Epple Bay, in B1-3; and also B1-5, Richborough).
