

B5-4: BARREL JARS, PLAIN AND GLOBULAR WITH BEAD RIM


Usually has a good burnish, like all of this section. Like B5-1, the rim and base diameters are about the same; and an omphalos base is sometimes found. Large and small.

Notes

Like B5-1, this is a native burial form, pre-conquest and confined to the heart of the area of grog-tempering; some at least of these burials are 1st century BC. Cf. the omphalos bowls group, S3.

BS-4: The rim and base diameter are about the same and the rim is slightly flared. The base is sometimes found, large and small.
