

G1-2: COPIES OF THE GALLO-BELGIC FORM Cam.2:
SIMILAR TO Cam.1 BUT WITH BULGING WALL

Not common; it is not clear that this form is intentional. The Prae Wood variation of an exterior bulge at the carination is visible here as in G1-1.

Notes

The originals (Cam.2) were in true TN only, and like Cam.1 normally pre-conquest at Sheepen, but not always (Periods I-IV, c.AD 10-60). TN examples at Braughing are in late Augustan-Claudian levels, c.10 BC - AI> 50 (Rigby in Partridge 1981).
