Notes

Cam.8 is a copy, usually in TN, of Cam.7, which is in turn a close copy of the Arretine Loeschcke IA and thus more often TR (Hawkes & Hull 1947, 217). Cam.7 is late Augustan-Claudian (Rigby 1978, 198-199); Cam.8 is I-IV/VI (c.AD 10-60/65) at Sheepen and goes on being imported to Britain until c.AD 70 (Rigby 1978, 190). There are some copies in Roman grey wares also at Sheepen. The grog-tempered version, G1-6, has evidently a fairly late place in this family tree, and the list of dates above bears this out: the Julliberries Grave and Birchington pots are in post-conquest cemeteries. It begins early enough at Braughing, which has early imports, but its flourishing in Kent is mostly post-conquest.
