Notes

Cam.56, itself copying Loeschcke 7 & 8, is very common in Britain and has several variants in TR and TN. These 'were being made by c.AD 10 and were still being produced in the Neronian period' (Rigby 1978, 199). Of the copies, Cam.57, at Sheepen there was one in Roman grey ware, but the others were native, all dark grey: two in the type trays are of soft brown grog with dark grey surfaces, others are romanised, and pale grey.

The list above shows the similar date range elsewhere. Skeleton Green, at Braughing, did not need copies.
