7A2.4 Upchurch N3/lb. JS. 43-120/140. Some similarity with Dr 32. Rare. 7A3 With a groove below the bead.

7A3.1 Cliffe S5/4b. HC. 43-100. Similar to conquest period Cam 251a. Rare. 7A3.2 Upchurch S1/1b pink, also S1/4b. JD. 50-150. Analysed as UA28 (Monaghan

Class 7B Carinated, with internal ridge.

7B1 The carination is half way up the body.

7B1.1 Upchurch S3/lb. RV 685. 43-70. Firmly first century (Southwark VA). Could pre-date conquest. Rare.

7B1.2 Shorne S1/5b grey-green. MA. 43-70. Possibly an Upchurch product. Rare.


7B1.3 Upchurch Sl/lbs. MM 5 UC 27. 43-70. Rare. 7B1.4 Upchurch S5/lb. JS. 43-70. Rare.


7B2 The carination is just below the rim.

7B2.1-2 Cliffe H2/4b. HC. 40/50-70. From TN form Cam 12 of AD 10-61. Rare,

Class 7C With facetted walls.

7C1.1 Upchurch Nl/lb. JD. 43-70. Compare Cam 24 of AD 49-65 and Thompson Gl-4.5, 10 be - AD 50. Rare.





Class 7D Smooth walled with internal ridge.

7D1 Plain.

7D1.1 Upchurch I2/lb. HC. 43-90/120. Cam 13 is AD 10-61, later than 7E. Form is pre-120 (Val Rigby pers. com.). In deposit dated AD 50-90 (West Kent 117, 304-305). Thompson Gl-7 is invasion period. Rare.

7D1.2 Cooling S1/6b. MCAIE. 43-200. This form is not in keeping with the rest of Cooling output, although the fabric is appropriate. It is very possibly a late second century aberration on 5E.

7D2 With an external groove.

7D2.1 Cliffe S5/4b. HC. 43-70. Rare. A similar vessel in the Arnold Collection has been omitted as it is stamped and therefore probably exotic.

Class 7E With short, vertical wall.

7E1.1 Cliffe Sl/4b pink. HC. 43-60. Cam 2b, dated 10-61. It is thought to be typologically earlier than class 7D. Rare.

Class 7F Simple platter with angled wall.

7F1 Plain.

7F1.1 Cooling S1/6b. MC.AKJ. 50-70. Rare. 7F2 With external groove.

7F2.1 Cooling SI/6b. MCA IE. 50-70 ? Possibly an aberrant 5F. Rare.

TYPE 8 MORTARIA

There is as yet no mortaria production suspected in the north Kent marshes.
